Attendance and punctuality

There is clear evidence that strong attendance at school links to strong educational outcomes for students. If your child's attendance is below 90%, we will expect to work closely to understand your family context and work with you on providing the support you need to help your child improve their attendance.

We appreciate that for many of you, punctuality is not within your control, as you rely on SEN transport providers to bring your child to and from school.

However, where you are in control of the journey to school, we do expect a punctual arrival.

Despite a heavy flow of traffic, all students have been consistently in lessons by 9.15am each morning unless their transport has arrived late.

In the same way as we monitor attendance, we now also monitor punctuality and will be inviting the families of those students who are <u>regularly</u> late to explain their situation to us so that we can support improved compliance with a punctual arrival to school.

School uniform and personal presentation

All students must wear a full school uniform (formal on the days with no PE, and PE uniform on the days when PE lessons take place).

Assemblies

Assemblies are facilitated by Mrs Tobin (Deputy Headteacher), Miss Gibney (Assistant Headteacher – Primary Department) and Mr Mason (Assistant Headteacher – Secondary Department).

Each week a different class will contribute to the assembly. When your child's class leads the assembly, their teacher will contact you in advance to let you know.

We work with high expectations that by the end of the year, all students will be able to sit through a whole assembly and listen well.

However, we recognise that this skill, like any, needs to be taught.

In order to do so, we will follow a graduated approach to full attendance in assembly for our youngest students.

We warmly welcome families to attend assemblies (with coffee morning on the same day).

However, if your child leaves assembly before the end, you are invited to leave with your child and enjoy a focussed "stay and play" session with your child.

Where the weather permits, we will be making great use of our fantastic grounds.

Visual Stress Information

What is Visual Stress?

Visual stress is the experience of unpleasant visual symptoms when reading, especially for long periods of time. Symptoms include illusions of shape, movement and colour in the text. It can also include distortions of the print, loss of clarity and general visual irritation. It can cause sore eyes, headaches and frequent loss of place when reading.

It is caused by the striped effect of black writing on white paper which causes over stimulation and excitation of the visual cortex. Visual stress, if identified, is also known as "Meares-Irlen Syndrome" or "Scotopic Sensitivity Syndrome". The condition, if diagnosed, will always be present and there is no life-long cure.

However, the symptoms can be eased by the use of an overlay and this is why it is key to screen and support the child affected by it.

What is a coloured overlay?

A coloured overlay is a transparent sheet of coloured plastic that can be placed over a page so as to colour the text. The sheet enables some people to read more fluently with less discomfort and fewer symptoms of Visual Stress.

Your child's results

Once the class team have completed the screening, and if the syndrome appears to be present, the Class Teacher will contact you to share their findings and to discuss strategies that will be used in class and others that you may wish to consider at home.
